- (b) Three firms have been licensed for the manufacture of electric arc melting furnaces for a total capacity of Rs. 200 lakhs per annum. Three firms have been licensed for the manufacture of induction snelting furnaces, the capacity in each of these cases has to be determined yet.

i The Government of India handed back Messrs. Atherton West & Co. l.ut.. Kanpur. to an elected Board of Directors on 13th February, 1965. The binding 'over was not subject to any terms, but before the handing over was done, the State Government had in formed the Government of India that Messrs. D port & Co. Ltd., Calcutta, who were pro posed to be appointed as Si redeemed the guarantee given by the State Government to the Central Bank of ilndia for financing the mills and had jabsolved the State Government of all 'liabilities arising from the deed of guarantee. They had also furnished a 'Bank guarantee for repayment of all iGovernment and semi-GovernmeiH dues. In addition they had made provision for the necessary cash credit arrangements for the satisfactory working of the mills and had agreed to make necessary proviision for the modernisation of (he mills.
