COMPLAINTS RECEIVED THROUGH SADACHAR SAMITI

THE MINISTER OF HOME AFFAIRS

(SHRI GULZARI LAL NANDA): (a) During
December, 1964 and January and February
1965, 274 complaints were received by the
Ministry of Home Affairs through the
Sanyukta Sadachar Samiti.

(b) The large majority of these com-
plaints were of delay or miscellaneous
grievances or requests for relief in various
ways. There were some complaints of
corruption and a few of inequity. The
complaints were forwarded to the Minis-
tries or the Government of State or Union
Territories concerned who looked into
them and took appropriate action.

(c) Accommodation for the head office
of the Samiti has been given free by Gov-
ernment. No financial assistance has been
given to the Samiti by Government.

DAY HOMES FOR STUDENTS IN DELHI

711. SHRI DEVI SINGH: Will the Minister
of EDUCATION be pleased to state:

(a) whether it is a fact that the students in
Delhi are facing acute difficulty of
accommodation; and

(b) if so, whether Government would
consider the construction of day homes for
them?

THE MINISTER OF EDUCATION (SHRI M.
C. CHAGLA): (a) and (b) So far as students in
Higher Secondary Schools are concerned,
there is no difficulty of accommodation. In the
case of college students, the University of
Delhi has informed that there is no serious
difficulty of accommodation for resident
students. There are, however, a large number
of day scholars whose accommodation
problem in their homes is detrimental to their
studies.

The University Grants Commission has accepted the proposal of Delhi University for the construction of a non-resident students' centre.

**CENSOR OF GREETINGS SENT BY THE
PRIME MINISTER TO M.P.S. DETAINED
UNDER DEFENCE OF INDIA RULES**

712. SHRI NIREN GHOSH: Will the Minister of HOME AFFAIRS be pleased to state:

(a) whether it is a fact that communications containing greetings sent by the Prime Minister to the Members of Parliament detained under Defence of India Rules are censored by Deputy Inspectors-General of Intelligence Bureau of States; and

(b) if not, what are the reasons for which the letter of greetings sent by the Prime Minister to Shri Niren Ghosh, M.P., was censored by Deputy Inspector-General of Intelligence Bureau of West Bengal?

THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF HOME AFFAIRS (SHRI JAISUKHLAL HATHI): (a) No, Madam.

(b) A greetings card sent by (he Prime Minister to Shri Niren Ghosh, M.P., was redirected by the office of the Communist Party of India in Calcutta to the Deputy Inspector-General, Intelligence Branch, Calcutta. The Deputy Inspector-General, Intelligence Branch, passed it on to Shri Niren Ghosh in Dum Dum Central Jail where the latter is under detention.

**CORRUPTION IN DELHI MUNICIPAL
J CORPORATION**

713. SHRI SITARAM JAIPURIA: Will the Minister of HOME AFFAIRS be pleased to state:

(a) whether Government's attention has been drawn to a survey report of the Indian Institute of Public Administration entitled "The experience of citizens in getting water connections—a study in corruption" wherein it has been mentioned that ninety-five per cent, of Delhi citizens

find the Municipal Corporation corrupt and inefficient;

(b) if the reply to part (a) above be in the affirmative, whether Government have formulated any proposals to root out corruption and inefficiency in the Corporation; and

(c) if so, what are the details of the proposals?

THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF HOME AFFAIRS (SHRI JAISUKHLAL HATHI): (a) The Indian Institute of Public Administration conducted a survey in October 1964 on "the experience of citizens in getting water connections" (A study in corruption).

(b) and (c) The report is under examination.
