SHARAVATHY POWER STATION

Written Answers

A total provision of Rs. 681.69 lakhs has been made in the State Plans for the promotion of Indigenous Systems of Medicine which beside Ayurveda include, Siddha Unani, Nature Cure, Yoga and Homoeopathy. Out of this, the State Governments have allotted in all a sum of Rs. 239.21 lakhs for education in Indigenous Systems of Medicine and it is estimated that the total outlay during the Plan period will be Rs. 145.72 lakhs. The State-wise allocation and the anticipated outlay is indicated below:

The actual allotment for Ayurvedic studies and the expenditure incurred by the State Governments is not available.

The Central Government has given, by way of direct grants, from out of the provision of Rs. 100 lakhs for development of Indigenous Systems of Medicine, a total sum of Rs. 6,57,600 for upgrading of three private Ayurvedic Colleges. The Central Government has also given the following grants for the establishment of post-Graduate-cum-Research Centres in Ayurveda:

(Not Indian Audit Education Association). The allotment was made after consulting the Ministry of Education.

(c) Out of about 24,777 square feet of covered area, 8,213 square feet has been rented out to the Board of Higher Secondary Education and the rental is stated to be Rs. 4,500 per month.
