C. R. PATTABHI RAMAN: We fe t that it was no'c proper to hold music festivals when people in the count) y we:e suffering due to floods and were having uiftijulties due to

SHRI LOKANATH MISRA: Classical music is fast dying out in this country and 'that is a very important aspec: of cuitur^. The classical music programmes and radio sammelans gave an occasion for classical musicians to display their ability through the All India Radio. Can I take it for granted that the Government of India wants c'assical music to die out in this country?

SHRFMATI INDIRA GANDHI: No, Madam, we do not. In fact, we want to encourage it very much more and I do not think that the suspension of one particular Sammelan is going to help ^assical music to die in 'this country. Holding of the Sammelan involved a large number of people coming hore ani at that particular stage of food shortage we felt that it was not desirable.

SHRI RAJENDRA PRATAP SINHA: I w'uld like to know from the hon. Minister if she is aware that these Sangeet Sammelans have got other aspects, name'y, the interrration of the country as a whole, not only at the cultural level. How does she propose to do that, si that the All India Radio could nlay its ro' in the cultural integration of the country hy such types of Sammelans be'ng held?

SHHIMATI INDIRA GANDHI: Madam, such types of Sammelans are not given up. This was done on one spec'al occasion, because we did not feel it right that there should be any kind of entertainment which would involve all these people .coming here and which invo'ved wastage of food.

SHRI BHUPESH GUPTA: I can well understand the ?ood sentiments in suspending the programme. May I

know from the hon. Minister whether this particular programme was replaced or substituted by some other programme giving expression to the sorrow and agony caused by the Government because of its food policy?

## SCIENCE EDUCATION THROUGH RADIO BROADCASTS

- \*310. THAKUR BHANU PRATAP SINGH: Will the Minister of Information and Broadcasting be pleased to state:
- (a) whether Government are considering any scheme for science education through radio broadcasting; and
- (b) if so, what are the details of the scheme?

THE MINISTER OF INFORMATION AND BROADCASTING (SHRIMATI GANDHI;: (a) and (b) There is no scheme for science education as such but All India Radio regularly broadcasts a number of talks, discussions and features on scientific subjects.

THAKUR BHANU PRATAP SINGH: May 1 know when such broadcasts are made? Every week?

SHRI C. R. PATTABHI RAMAN: Actually, Madam, there are for university students science discussions and these programmes are broadcast from all the major stations of the All India Radio. In addition, in Television programmes which are being put out, lessons are telecast on Physics and Chemistry, and these fo'low the Higher Secondary Examination Course. Then several stations regu\* larly broadcast quarterly reviews on science. There are also talks and features on science in the National Programme.

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SHRI M. P. BHARGAVA: May I know whether these radio broadcasts are in English only or in other Indian languages also?

SHRI C. R. PATTABHI RAMA\*; To my knowledge, most of them a~e in English especially on science subjects.

## AMMUNITION FACTORY AT VARAGAON

- •311. SHRI S. C. DEB: Will the Minister of DEFKNCB be pleased to state:
- (a) whether it is a fact that z. new-ammunition factory at Varangaon was opened by him on 15th October, 1964;
- (b) if so, what kind of ammunition would be produced there and what would be its size; and
- (c) the modern *avd* particular type of arms, to be manufactured at the factory?

THE MINISTER OF DEFENCE PRODUCTION IN THE MINISTRY OF DEFENCE (SHRI A. M. THOMAS): (a) Yes, Sir.

- (b) This factory will produce 7' 62 nan. ammunition.
- (c) This factory will not produce arms of any type.

श्री राम सहाव : व ा मैं जान सकूंगा कि विजनी एम्यूनेशन फैक्टरीज खोलने शा विचार या और उसमें से कितनों को डाप कर दिया गया है कि वे नहीं खोली जायेंगी ?

SHRI A. M. THOMAS: I have made a statement some time back about the new factories that are coming up and about two factories which were intended to be put up being dropped. That is an exhaustive statement and everything is contained in it.

श्री राम सहायः वे कौन कौन सी फैक्ट-रियां हैं, जिन्हें ड्राप कर दिया गया है ? SHRI A. M. THOMAS: The Panwal and the Burla factories.

SHRI M. P. BHARGAVA: What would be the total saving in foreign exchange when this factory goes into full production?

SHRI A. M. THOMAS: It is not advisable to give the quantum of production of this factory. The foreign exchange saving would be consiler-able. In fact when we are putting up other new factories to feed those factories, ammunition also would be necessary. This is mainly for meeting the requirements of 7-62 mm. rifles, and it will also meet the requirements of all the three Services, Navy, Air Force and Army.

## RAILWAY LINE BETWEEN EAST PAKISTAN AND NEPAL

- \*312. SHRI P. C. MITRA: Will the Minister of EXTERNAL AFFAIRS be pleased to state:
- (a) whether it is a fact that the Government of Pakistan has been permitted to construct a lailway line connecting Eist Pakistan and Nepal passing through Indian territory; and

THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MNISTRY OF EXTERNAL AFFAIRS (SHHIMATI LAKSHMI N. MENON); (a) No, Sir.
