Will the Minister of EXTERNAL AFFAIRS be pleased to refer to the answer to Starred Question No. 296 in the Rajya Sabha on the 1st December, 1964 and state:

(a) whether the Government of the United States has lodged a protest with the Government of India against the statement made by Shri B. N. Chakravarty, India's Permanent Representative to the United Nations, at a meeting of 21-number working group on October 6, 1964, in regard to sharing of the cost of U.N. Peace making operations; and

(b) if so, what reply the Government of India has sent to the Government of the United States?

THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF EXTERNAL AFFAIRS (SHRIMATI LAKSHMI N. MENON):

(a) and (b) The Government of the United States has not lodged a protest with the Government of India against the statement made on October 6, 1964, by Shri B. N. Chakravarty, Permanent Representative of India to the United Nations, in the Working Group of 21. But the U.S. Secretary of State had addressed a letter to our Minister for External Affairs in which he drew attention to the statement made by Ambassador Chakravarty and asked whether it signified a change in India's attitude to the question of financing of UN peace-keeping operations and the applicability of Article 19 of the Charter.

The Minister for External Affairs said in reply that there had been no change in India's attitude. He said that while we subscribed to the general principle of collective responsibility of member States of the UN for the financing of UN peace-

keeping operations, we felt that the serious differences that had arisen over the question of payment of arrears should be settled by mutual agreement. It would not be helpful to enforce decisions or apply penalties against member States who had fundamental objections to compulsory payment for UN peace-keeping operations.

(c) if so, what steps have been taken by Government to check such activities?]

(a) whether the rules relating to
the posting of personnel of the Indian
Armed Forces have been relaxed due
to emergency; and

(b) if so, what is the nature of the
relaxation?

THE MINISTER OF DEFENCE
(SHRI Y. B. CHAVAN): (a) There are
no rules relating to the position of
personnel of the Armed Forces but
some working principles have been
adopted and these have not been re-
laxed.

(b) Does not arise.

CHINESE INTRUSION IN LADAKH

REDDY: Will the Minister of
DEFENCE be pleased to state:

(a) whether it is a fact that recent-
ly the Chinese troops intruded into
the demilitarised zone in Ladakh and
set up stone cairns; and

(b) if so, whether Government have
taken any steps in the matter?

THE MINISTER OF DEFENCE (SHRI
Y. B. CHAVAN): (a) It is a fact that
Chinese troops have from time to time
intruded into the demilitarised zone
in Ladakh. It is also a fact that the
Chinese Government have set up
'stone cairns' at certain places in
Ladakh along the so-called 'line of
actual control'.

(b) Government of India have
lodged strong protests with the
Chinese Government bringing out the
facts of Chinese intrusion in the de-
militarised zone in Ladakh. On 26th
