#### FOODGRAINS DEALERS ARRESTED IN DELHI

\*104. SHRI PAL AT KUNHI KOTA: "Will the Minister of HOME AFFAIRS be pleased to state:

(a) the number of wholesale and retail foodgrain dealers and dealers of essential commodities whose houses and shops were raided by the au.ho-

rities and who were arrested in Delhi during the months of August, September and October, 1964 and the nature of punishment given to them; and

(b) what are the quantities of various commodities recovered from them and the manner of their disposal?

THE DEPUTY MINISTER IN THE MINISTRY OF HOME AFFAIRS (SHRI L. N. MISHRA): (a) and (b) A statement is laid on the Table of the House.

## STATEMENT

(a) Premises of 61 licensed wholesale and retail foodgrain dealers and dealers of essential commodities were raided by the police in collaboration with the Civil Supplies Department, Delhi and 81 persons were arrested. Out of the 61 cases, one case has been completed and has ended in conviction. The punishment awarded was imprisonment till the rising of the court, a fine of Rs. 2501- and confiscation of 13 bags of wheat involved.
