as Secretary, Ministry of Civil Aviation particularly because of his past experience as Chairman of the Indian Airlines Corporation and it was felt that the affairs of the Corporation required his services.

EXPERT COMMITTEE ON CLASSIFICATION
OF ARTISAN STAFF IN CIVIL AVIATION
WORKSHOPS

- *146. SHRI T. V. ANANDAN: Will the Minister of CIVIL AVIATION be pleased to state:
- (a) whether it is a fact that an Expert Committee as per the recommendation of the Second Pay Commission had been appointed to go into the question of classification of artisan staff employed in the workshop of the Civil Aviation Department;
- (b) if so, whether the Committee has submitted any report; and
- (c) if the answer to part (b) above be in the affirmative, what withholds implementation of the recommendations?

THE MINISTER OF CIVIL AVIATION (SHRI N. KANUNGO):
(a) to (c) A Committee of Departmental Officers was appointed by the Director-General of Civil Aviation to study and examine the pay scales of the workshop staff and to recommend whether any revision of their scales is necessary, after taking into consideration their duties and responsibilities and the scales of pay of similar posts in other departments.

The Committee has since submitted its report and its recommendations are under consideration of Government. The Committee's recommedations require detailed examination, in consultation with other Ministries concerned, from the point of view of financial implications and the future policy with regard to direct recruitment and departmental promotion to

the various posts. Efforts are being made to expedite policy decisions on these recommendations.
