

2. With a view to maintaining arid developing export markets, the following measures have been taken:

- (a) The production of raw jute and mesta in the country has been stepped up considerably and a target of 100 lakh bales has been set for the Fourth Plan;
- (b) The industry is maintaining production without any restrictions;
- (c) A jute Textiles Consultative Board and a Jute Goods Export Promotion Advisory Committee have been set up to advise Government on various matters relating to production and exports;
- (d) Continuous research is being carried on into new uses for jute and in this context the services of a renowned consultant in the U.S.A. have been engaged by the industry;
- (e) Proposals are also under consideration for expansion of the activities of the IJMA's Research Institute;
- (f) Compulsory Quality Control of jute goods is being introduced with effect from the 1st January 1965;
- (g) Regular market surveys are also being conducted by periodical delegations;
- (h) The industry has almost completely modernised its preparatory and spinning section; modernisation of the weaving section is expected to be taken up in the Fourth Plan;
- (i) Diversification of production is being encouraged.
