

(c) Different rates are due to such factors as:

- (i) Percentage of line losses in transmission of energy.
- (ii) Maintenance expenditure.
- (iii) Location of industrial establishments requiring large power supplies.]

FARAKKA BARRAGE PROJECT

216. SHRI D. L. SEN GUPTA: Will the Minister of IRRIGATION AND POWER be pleased to state:

(a) what is the estimated date of completion of the Farakka Barrage Project in West Bengal;

(b) whether there are any difficulties in the completion of the project within the originally estimated period; and

(c) if so, what steps have been taken to overcome those difficulties?

THE MINISTER OF IRRIGATION AND POWER (DR. K. L. RAO): (a) to (c) The Farakka Barrage Project is scheduled to be completed by 1970. Besides initial difficulties inherent in a Project of this magnitude, such as recruitment of experienced technical personnel, procurement of equipment, which have now been largely overcome, no insuperable difficulties have been experienced so far. High level periodical reviews and frequent consultations with the authorities concerned are held to ensure the completion of the Project within the estimated period.
