# Fertiliser unit at Neyveli Lignite Corporation

THE MINISTER OF STEEL AND MINES (SHRI N. SANJIVA REDDY): (a) The original estimated cost of the Neyveli Fertiliser scheme was Rs. 26-10 crores.

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(D) According to the original schedule prepared in 1956, the scheme was expected to commence production by December, 1961, but, there have been unavoidable delays. For example, the original scheme for producing ammonium sulphate based on Gypsum was modified and a decision was taken to produce Urea. The contracts for the supply of plant and equipment could be concluded only in October, 1959. There was also some set-back in the erection of the Plant owing to delay in the supply of indigenous steel for fabrication work. The various difficulties have been progressively overcome and production is scheduled to commence by February, 1966.

(c) Contracts have been concluded with M/s. Ansaldo of Italy **and** M/s. Pintsch Bamag Linde of Germany and not with Monte Catini. The contractors invoked the force *majeure* clause relating to delay in the supply of indigenous steel and claimed extra payment, which **was** mostly for meeting the increased expenditure on their technicians and other staff, owing to the extended period of the contracts.
