is one on Employment and Training under the Planning Commission for suggesting the plant target for the next plan period. They have, however, made no estimate of the backlog of unemployment at the end of 1965-66.

Increased Chinese activity on the northern borders

- 113. SHRI R. S. KHANDEKAR: Will the Minister of Defence be pleased to state:
- (a) whether it 15 a fact that there has been an increased Chinese activity along the entire northern borders of the country; and
 - (b) if so, what is its magnitude?

THE MINISTER OF DEFENCE (SHRIY, B. CHAVAN): (a) and (b) Chinese activity along our orders and in the areas occupied by them continues unabated. Their build-up is, and has been for some time, heavier than what it was during the autumn of 1962.

DEMANDS OF ALL INDIA PORT AND DOCK WORKERS FEDERATION

- (b) whether any of the arms of those Nagas have since come into the possession of Government of India or of the Government of Nagaland; and
- (c) whether any particular activities of these 400 hostile Nagas have been noticed?

THE MINISTER OF DEFENCE (SHRI Y. B. CHAVAN): (a) The rest of the Naga hostiles from this gang of 400 arc reported to have proceeded towards the SOMRA Tract in Burmese territory

- (b) No, Sir.
- (c) No, Sir.

MALTREATMENT OF INDIAN RESIDENTS IN CHINA

- 116. Shri UTTAM SINGH DUGAL: Will the Prime Minister be pleased to state:
- (a) whether there was any maltreatment or oppression of Indian residents in China during the Chinese aggression or afterwards; and
- (b) if so, what steps were taken to protect them from persecution?

THE PRIME MINISTER AND MIN-ISTER OF EXTERNAL AFFAIRS (SHRI GULZARI LAL NANDA): (a) The Indian nationals who are still living in China are living However, difficult conditions. cases of confiscation of their properties and denial to them of prescribed food rations, medical aid, etc., been reported to our Embassy

(b) After the closing down of our Consulate General in Shanghai, the

interests of these Indians are being looked after by our Embassy in Peking and the Embassy is doing everything to render them assistance wherever possible.

- (d) Yes, Sir; two complaints were received recently. One related to the alleged indifference of the High Commission towards the Indian Artists, who participated in Edinburgh Festival, and second pertained to alleged removal of portrait of Mahatma Gandhi from the Reading Room of the High Commission. ACTIVITIES OF HOSTILE NAGAS

- 120. SHRI R. K. BHUWALKA: Will the Minister of Defence be pleased to state:
- (a) whether it is a fact that the activities of hostile Nagas at present are on the increase;
- (b) if so, how many incidents occurred during the last month in which the hostile Nagas used arms and ammunition;
- (c) how many persons were killed and injured in those incidents; and
- (d) what step₃ are taken by Government to curb the activities of hostile Nagas?

THE MINISTER OF DEFENCE' (SHRI Y. B. CHAVAN): (a) There is no evidence to show that the Naga have recently hostiles intensified' their activities. However, their usual activities involving terrorism, intimidation of loval Nagas, extortion of money from civilians, dacoities and occasional firing on security columns and posts, continue.

- (b) Total number of encounters between security forces and Naga hostiles during the month of April, 1964 is 20.
- (c) As a result of encounters mentioned in (b) above, 18 hostiles were killed and 5 wounded. As regards Security Forces, 1 each of Army and Assam Rifles was killed and 4 each of Army and Assam Rifles and 2 Policemen were wounded.
- (d) All necessary steps are being taken by Government to curb the activities of hostile Nagas. It will not
