

Children falling ill due to mid-day meal

2187. DR. ALLADI P. RAJKUMAR: Will the Minister of HUMAN RESOURCE DEVELOPMENT be pleased to state:

(a) whether there were reports of several children dying and a large number of falling ill after eating rotten food at schools in Meerut, Kanpur and Unnao under mid-day meal scheme;

(b) if so, the details thereof and the action taken in this regard; and

(c) the steps taken to provide safe and hygienic foods to schools under mid-day meal scheme?

THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF HUMAN RESOURCE DEVELOPMENT (SHRIMATI D. PURANDESWARI): (a) to (c) As per information received from Government of Uttar Pradesh, reports about children having died at Meerut, Kanpur and Unnao after consuming mid-day meal at schools are not true. A few children took ill at Unnao allegedly because of contaminated pulse. An FIR has been lodged against the shopkeeper and the cook. In addition, the U.P. Government has taken the following steps:-

- (i) It has initiated steps to put in place a mechanism to ensure hygienic, wholesome food.
- (ii) It has directed district officers to implement the instructions regarding mid-day meal in letter and spirit.
- (iii) The Minister of Basic Education, Government of Uttar Pradesh has appealed to the Gram Pradhans to maintain cleanliness and provide good food at schools.

Central Government has also exhorted all States to mobilize mothers to take turns to oversee preparation of meal to ensure regularity and quality.
