TECHNOLOGICAL AND ENGINEERING INSTITUTES IN DELHI/NEW DELHI

796. SHRI LILA DHAR BAROOAH: Will the Minister of EDUCATION be pleased to state:

(a) the number and names of the technological and engineering institutions in Delhi/New Delhi with their locations;

(b) the percentage of marks that is required for admission in such institutions; and

(c) whether any special provision is made in favour of aspirant children of the low paid Government servants who have obtained less marks than the prescribed percentage fixed for admission into these institutions?

THE MINISTER OF EDUCATION (SHRI M. C. CHAGLA): (a) 1. Indian Institute of Technology, Hauz Khas, New Delhi.

2. Delhi Polytechnic, Kashmere Gate, Delhi.

3. School of Planning and Architecture, Indraparstha Estate, New Delhi.

4. Pusa Polytechnic, Pusa, New Delhi.

5. G. B. Pant Polytechnic, Okhla, New Delhi.

6. Boy's Polytechnic, Kashmere Gate, Delhi.

7. Women's Polytechnic, Rouse Avenue, New Delhi.

(b) *Indian Institute of Technology, New Delhi.*—No minimum marks are

prescribed. Admissions are made on the basis of an all-India Entrance Test conducted for all the five Institutes of Technology.

Delhi Polytechnic, Delhi.—Candidates with at least 60 per cent marks (55 per cent. for Scheduled Castes Scheduled Tribes) are eligible to apply.

School of Planning and Architecture, New Delhi.—For B. Arch. course, students with at least 50 per cent. marks (45 per cent. for Scheduled Castes/Scheduled Tribes) are eligible. For post-graduate and other specialised courses in Town and Country Planning and in Housing no minimum marks are prescribed.

Pusa Polytechnic, Pusa, New Delhi, G. B. Pant Polytechnic, Okhla, New Delhi, Boy's Polytechnic, Kashmere Gate, Delhi and Women's Polytechnic, Rouse Avenue, New Delhi.—No minimum marks are prescribed. Admissions to these institutions are made strictly on the basis of merit of the applicants.

(c) The issue does not arise in the case of institutions where no minimum marks have been prescribed; nor, in the case of institutions where admissions are made on the basis of an entrance test.

At the rest also no special provision has been made for the admission of children of low-paid government servants. However, the unfilled seats of the quota reserved for Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Tribes are allotted to these children, provided they possess the minimum marks prescribed for this quota.
