**BUILDING FOR TEXT BOOK  
PRINTING PRESS AT MYSORE**

\*406. SHRI C. M. POONACHA: Will the Minister of EDUCATION be pleased to state:

(a) whether plans and estimates for constructing building for the 'Text Book Printing Press' at Mysore have been sent to Government of India by Government of Mysore State for administrative approval; and

(b) if so, what action has been taken in the matter by Government of India?

THE MINISTER OF EDUCATION (SHRI M. C. CHAGLA): (a) Yes, Madam.

(b) The Government of India have broadly approved of the Plans and Estimates received on the 10th June, 1964. Some modifications suggested by the State Government have been received on 28th September, 1964. These are under examination.
