Tm MINISTER OF FOOD AND AGRICULTURE (SHRI C. SUBRAMA-NIAM): The more important o'. the steps taken by the Government to increase the availability o' foodgrains in the country and to check the rise in their prices are the following: —

(i) Increased distribution of foodgrains through fair price shops;

- (ii) Promulgation of anti-hoarding measures in the States;
- (iii) Stepping up of imports from abroad;
- (iv) Fixation of Maximum wholesale and retail prices of rice in most of the Stateg and maximum retail price of wheat in Rajasthan;
- (v) Strengthening of enforcement and Administrative machinery in the States; and
- (vi) Tightening up of restrictions n bank advance* against foodgrains.
