(b) Whether any action, beyond premature retirement, should be taken would depend on the circumstances and merits of each individual case.

#### SETTING UP OF A CENTRAL BUREAU OF BOOKS PRODUCTION

284. SHRI SUNDAR MANI PATEL: Will the Minister of EDUCATION be pleased to state:

(a) whether Government have proposed setting up of a Central Bureau of Books Production;

(b) if so, details of its functions; and

(c) when it is likely to start functioning and how much would it cost the Central Exchequer?

THE DEPUTY MINISTER IN THE MINISTRY OF EDUCATION (SHRI BHAKT DARSHAN): (a) to (c) A scheme to set up a Central Bureau of Books Production is proposed to be

included in the Fourth Plan for the development of Hindi and other Indian languages. Details of the scheme and its financial implications have yet to be worked out.

#### PAKISTANI PENETRATION IN RAJASTHAN

285. SHRI DEVI SINGH: Will the Minister of HOME AFFAIRS be pleased to state:

(a) whether it is a fact that a large number of Pakistanis have recently penetrated into Rajasthan; and

(b) if so, what are the details thereof and what action the Government of India have taken to stop such unauthorised entry of Pakistanis in our country?

THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF HOME AFFAIRS (SHRI JAISUKHLAL HATHI): (a) and (b) Only 91 Pakistanis were detected for illegal entry into Rajasthan during 1964 (till July). A statement showing the action taken against these persons and the arrangements made to stop their unauthorised entry into India is attached.
