respective posts under the National Discipline Scheme.

- (b) No quota is fixed for each State, but the allocation of seats is made keeping in view the requirements of the States and the total number of vacancies for a particular course.
- (c) to (e) The information is being collected from the concerned Regional office of the National Discipline Scheme and a statement will be laid on the Table of the House in due course.
