(b) No, Sir. Constituted on the basis of the recommendations of the Press Commission, the Central Press Accreditation Committee consists of an equal number of editors nominated by the All India Newspaper Editors' Conference and working journalists nominated by the Indian Federation of Working Journalists.

EXPENDITURE ON VARIOUS MEDIA UNITS OF THE MINISTRY

382. SHRI DAHYABHAI V. PATEL: Will the Minister of INFORMATION AND BROADCASTING be pleased to state:

(a) the steps Government propose to take for effecting economy in expenditure on the various Media Units falling under her Ministry; and

(b) the present strength of the staff in the Press Information Bureau as compared to the previous two years?

THE MINISTER OF INFORMATION AND BROADCASTING (SHRIMATI INDIRA GANDHI): (a) The importance of the need for economy has been kept constantly in mind. Economies in 1962-63 amounted to Rs-30.67 lakhs and in 1963-64 to Rs. 70.80 lakhs. In addition, deferment of two of III Plan schemes resulted in a saving of Rs. 84- 02 lakhs. Further, other measures are being considered.

(b) The strength of the staff of the Press Information Bureau as on 1-3-64 was 987 as compared to that of 994 on 1.3.63 and 932 on 1.3.62.
