533. SHRI SITARAM JAIPURIA: Will the Minister of EXTERNAL AFFAIRS be pleased to state:

(a) whether Government are aware that the Pan American Airways has published an Asian Map, known as the President Special, where Kashmir has been shown as an independent country; and

(b) if so, whether Government have taken any action to ban the import of such maps into India?

THE MINISTER OF EXTERNAL AFFAIRS (SARDAR SWARAN SINGH):

(a) and (b) Government have no information on the subject, but necessary enquiries are being made.

(d) whether Government have looked into these allegations and conducted any inquiry into the activities of the College?

U.S. OPERATIONS AGAINST NORTH VIET-NAMESE MILITARY INSTALLATIONS

Will the Minister of EXTERNAL AFFAIRS be pleased to state:

(a) whether the Government of India have sent any reply to President Johnson's letter regarding action taken by United States against North Viet-Nameese military installations; and

(b) if so, what is the content of the reply sent?

THE MINISTER OF EXTERNAL AFFAIRS (SARDAR SWARAN SINGH):

(a) and (b) Yes, Sir. In his reply, the Prime Minister drew the attention of the President of the United States to the Statement issued by the Government of India on 5 August, 1964 in which they had expressed the hope that the situation would not be further aggravated and that, at least, the uneasy peace which prevailed in this area before these incidents would immediately be restored.
