EXEMPTION OF DUTY GRANTED TO SMALLER STRAWBOARD UNITS

*384 SHRI SITARAM JAIPURIA: Will the Minister of Finance be pleased to state:

- (a) whether it is a fact that smaller units producing strawboard have been granted special exemption of Duty;
- (b) if so, what are the reasons for giving such an exemption; and
- (c) whether Government propose to extend similar exemption to small sugar factories?

THE MINISTER • PLANNING (SHRI B. R. BHAGAT): (a) Prior to 1-3-1964, slab exemptions with preferential rates of duty were available only to smaller units producing strawboard. However, slab exemptions have been now extended to all manufacturers irrespective of their output on equitous considerations.

(b) The rate of duty on 'Straw Boards' was raised from 15 nP. per Kg. to 35 nP. per Kg. in 1963, bringing the 'Straw Board' fully on par with—'Mill Boards' and 'Grey Boards'. Simultaneously liberalised slab exemptions with preferential rates as enjoyed by Mill-Boards were prescribed to help the smaller units, manufacturing strawboards also. How ever, as this gave excessive benefits to marginal producers, the scheme has had to be further revised.

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STATEMENT

(a) and (b) The original project report for the Lower Jhelum Hydroelectric Scheme was received from the Jammu and Kashmir Government in the Central Water and Power Commission in August. 1962. was, however, revised by the State Government in August, 1963. Project is economically and technically feasible.

The scheme was considered in the meeting of the Technical Advisory Committee on Irrigation and Flood Control on the 17th January, 1964, in which it was decided that a small Committee consisting of the officers of Central Water and Power Commission and the Planning Commission should discuss the technical aspects of scheme and their report should then be considered at the next meeting. The next meeting was held on the 30th January, 1964 but as the report of the Committee was not ready, was decided to postpone consideration of the project to the next meeting.
