OUTPUT OF STEEL PLANTS

OIL REFINERY AT COCHIN

123. SHRI A. D. MANI: Will the Minister of PETROLEUM AND CHEMICALS be pleased to state how soon the oil refinery at Cochin will start production?

THE MINISTER OF PETROLEUM AND CHEMICALS (SHRI HUMAYUN KABIR): According to the terms of the Agreement dated 27th April 1963, the construction is estimated to be completed within 30 months from the date of Agreement, i.e., by October/November, 1965 and full production is likely to commence as from 1st January, 1966.

MANUFACTURE OF BEEHIVE HARD-COKE

124. SHRI M. P. BHARGAVA: Will the Minister of STEEL, MINES AND HEAVY ENGINEERING be pleased to state:

(a) whether there is any partial or complete ban on the manufacture of beehive hard-coke;

(b) if so, in what way Government propose to meet the demand of its conventional users; and

(c) whether there is any proposal to relax restrictions on its manufacture?

THE MINISTER OF STEEL, MINES AND HEAVY ENGINEERING (SHRI C. SUBRAMANIAM): (a) and (c) About nine collieries in the Jharia coal-field were manufacturing beehive hard coke from coals of Grade III. Since such coke was of a poor quality, instructions were issued to these collieries to stop its production. But in
