## HIGHER SECONDARY EDUCATION

345. SHRI SITARAM JAIPURIA: Will the Minister of EDUCATION be pleased to state:

(a) the names of State Governments which have not favoured the system of Higher Secondary Education;

(b) what are the reasons for which these States have not favoured this system; and

(c) what are the decisions arrived at the recent meeting of the All India Higher Secondary Advisory Council?

THE MINISTER OF EDUCATION  
(SHRI M. C. CHAGLA): (a) Gujarat,

Madras, Maharashtra, Kerala and Uttar Pradesh.

(b) Due to difficulties of personnel and finance.

(c) The All India Council for Secondary Education at its meeting held in October, 1963 recommended as follows: —

(i) The national pattern of secondary education should have an underlying uniformity throughout the country.

(ii) The desirable national pattern is as under: —

(a) a total schooling of 12 years should be given to students admitted at the age of 6 in class I;

(b) the last 4 years should constitute the secondary stage of education;

(c) an examination called higher secondary part I should be provided at the end of the first two years of the secondary stage in order to enable students to take up specialised and diversified courses at the secondary stage;

(d) the examination at the end of the secondary stage should be called the higher secondary part II examination; and

(e) the standard to be attained at the end of the secondary stage should approximate to the old Intermediate standard and make the student eligible for admission to the 3 year degree course without the necessity of having to go through any other preparatory course like the P.U.C.

(iii) The transition to the desirable pattern may take place

in one step or in two stages—(i) by the addition of one year at the end of the 10-year course; and (ii) by the addition of another year to the 11-year course. The schools which have been upgraded to the 11-year higher secondary pattern should be deemed to have covered the first stage. The students who complete these courses successfully should continue to be eligible to the 3-year degree course. Further, there should be parallelism in the syllabus adopted in (a) the 9th and 10th class\* of the traditional secondary schools and the upgrade schools and (b) the P.U.C. at the 11th class of the upgrade 11-year schools.

(iv) All States and Union Territories should take effective steps to move towards achieving the desirable pattern within a reasonable time and the steps should be taken which run counter to the national pattern. In particular, where the schooling period is less than 12 years it should be immediately increased to at least 12 years. For a 10-year schooling the examination at the end of the 10th class should be called higher secondary part I to indicate the incompleteness of the school course.
