QUARRYING OF COAL IN RAMGARH AREA

THE MINISTER OF STEEL MINES AND HEAVY ENGINEERING (SHRI C. Subramaniam): (a) and (b) A coal mine in Ramgarh, with an annual target of 1.5 million tonnes, is proposed to be developed by the National Coal Development Corporation, under the United States Agency for International Development (A.I.D.) programme. M/s. Pierce Management Corporation of the U.S.A., deputed by the A.I D., have prepared a project report for the production of 1.26 million tonnes by open-cast mining) and 0.24 million tonnes from under-ground mines, at a total cost of about Rs. 6.75 crores. The foreign exchange component of the cost will be Rs. 2.9 crores, and the A.I.D. authorities are presently considering the question of granting a loan of this amount to cover the cost of import of machinery and equipment.
