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replying in an evasive way, just to shut me out. I would like the Minister to give a specific reply to il.

Member mentioned something about the extent of evasion and I said: I take the information from the hon. Member because I was not aware of it. If I knew the persons who were evading, they would no longer evade.

EXPORT OF BANANAS

*429. SHRI DEOKINANDAN NA-RAYAN: Will the Minister of INTER-

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NATIONAL TRADE be pleased to state the names of States in India from which bananas' were exported during 1961-62, 1962-63 and upto October 1963?

THE MINISTER OF INTERNATIONAL TRADE (SHRI MANUBHAI SHAH): Statewise statistics of export of bananas are not available, but exports are largely from Maharashtra and Gujarat States. However, a country-wise statement showing exports of bananas in 1961, 1962 and 1963 (Jan.— Sept.) is laid on the Table of the House.

SHRI DEOKINANDAN NARAYAN: The statement shows that 11,509 tonnes were exported. May I know from what particular States they were exported and in what quantity?

SHRI MANUBHAI SHAH; That is exactly what I answered. Most of them were from Maharashtra, some from Madras, some from Gujarat and some from the Calcutta and Orissa regions.

SHRI DEOKINANDAN NARAYAN: A month or so back bananas were sent to Italy. May I know, Sir, if the bananas reached Italy in good condition and if not, what are the reasons? SHRI MANUBHAI SHAH: They reached in very good condition and we are already finalising a contract for the sale of 10,000 tonnes of bananas to Italy.

SHRI DEOKINANDAN NARAYAN: May I know. Sir, what quantity of bananas were sent to Russia recently and if they reached in good condition?

SHRI MANUBHAI SHAH: They are always supposed to reach in good condition. As a matter of 'fact, I had information from the Ministry of Foreign Trade in the 'Soviet Union that out of the thousand tonnes which reached them, 700 tonnes were mopped up in less than an hour and another 300 tonnes, which were not of the first class variety—it was slightly damaged in transit or whatever it is—were also consumed very promptly. They are placing orders for further quantities.

SHRI DEOKINANDAN NARAYAN: My information is that three-fourths of the bananas that were sent to Italy were spoiled on the way.

SHRI MANUBHAI SHAH: No, Sir.

SHRI AKBAR ALI KHAN: May I know the policy of the Government regarding local consumption and the export of bananas?

SHRI MANUBHAI SHAH: We are the third largest producers of bananas in the world. We produce 2.1 million tonnes. Exports are ranging from 25,000 tonnes to 50,000 tonnes. There is no use worrying, every time we start exporting, about what is likely to happen. As a matter of fact, that is such a tremendous wastage and the potentialities for the growing of bananas in this country are so enormous that we should export as much as we can.

SHRI K. S. CHAVDA: May I know, Sir, whether co-operative societies are exporting bananas?

SHRI MANUBHAI SHAH: Yes, Sir, We have divided the country into three zones. For the eastern zone a corporation called the Plantation Corporation of India is being established in Orissa - Orissa, Bihar, Bengal and Assam, four States, collaborating for banana and fruit development and export. For Maharashtra and Gujarat, we have two apex co-operative societies, functioning jointly together. The third one is the South India Banana and Fruit Development Corporation. Madras. Andhra, Kerala and Mysore collabora-ti g together. These two Corporations in the public sector and one cooperative sector will collaborate with private ^a= well as co-operative producers of bananas and fruits and will launch a massive campaign for export.

SHRI N. SRI RAMA REDDY: I would like to know i*f recently a Banana Mission was sent abroad and, if they have returned, what report they have given of the prospects of building up a big export trade in bananas.

SHRI MANUBHAI SHAH: The delegation was highly successful. They visited Iran, Iraq. Syria, Lebanon. Belgium, Germany, the U.K.. France, Switzerland and Italy. They procured on the spot orders—13,000 tonnes for Italy, 6,000 tonnes for Iraq and 5,000 tonnes for Iran. Their report shows that our bananas are very popular and if properly developed and scientifically exported, there to a tremendous market. As a matter of fact, the world trade in bananas is Rs. 240 crores.

Dr. M. M. S. SIDDHU: May I know from the hon. Minister what is the wastage of bananas? He said in his supplementary that there is considerable wastage of banana_s in the country.

SHRI MANUBHAI SHAH: As far as wastage is concerned, it is not the concern of this question particularly, nor are we looking after bananas in a Central way. Like any other fruit OT vegetable, wastage is inescapable. What is wanted is scientific development of the right quality of bananas both for internal and external consumption.

SHRI DEOKINANDAN NARAYAN: May I know, Sir, what particular variety of bananas was exported, whether from the South, Maharashtra or Gujarat, and whether they were liked or not by the people outside?

SHRI MANUBHAI SHAH: All varieties all are popular.

RAJKUMARI AMRIT KAUR: I would only like to ask the Minister whether this export trade in bananas is going to have an adverse effect on the price of bananas here, which *is* the poor man's food.

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SHRI MANUBHAI SHAH; No, Sir, not at all. On the contrary, the poor grower and the cultivator and everybody else will get better paid as a result of these efforts. We have totally lacked quality consciousness in all production spheres of banana because no special attention is paid. They are allowed to grow naturally. No quality catering is done and the proper type of fertiliser is not used. The price question will not, as I said, be a matter of worry at all.

RAJKUMARI AMR.IT KAUR: It is not an answer to my question. Will the price of bananas go up here because of these large exports? That is what I am trying to get at.

SHRI MANUBHAI SHAH: No, Sir.

MR. CHAIRMAN; Mr. Tariq. We are still on the bananas.

KONCH BELI AND CHANDNI DAMS m HIMACHAL PRADESH

•430. Shri SHIVA NAND RAMAUL: Will the Minister of IRRIGATION AND POWER be pleased to state whether the Konch Beli Dam Project and Chandni Dam Project in Himachal Pradesh have since been dropped?

THE MINISTER OF IRRIGATION AND POWER (DR. K. L. RAO) : At an inter-State meeting held on 7-11-1963 to discuss the Yamuna Development Schemes, it was agreed inter alia to drop the Konch Beli Dam (Koch Dam) Project. As regards Chandni Dam, it was agreed that the Himachal Pradesh Government will carry out in-vest gations at other sites and prepare a project report for a dam on river Giri above its confluence with Jala], and if necessary, another dam on its tributary Jalal.

SHRI N. SRI RAMA REDDY: May I know the reasons for dropping the Konch Beli Dam Project?

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
