(b) Yes, Sir.

(c) Selections to Group 'C' posts are made by Railway Recruitment Boards on all India basis. State-wise or region-wise statistics of the selected candidates are not maintained by Railway Recruitment Boards.

(d) There are 10,530 vacancies on North-East Frontier Railway as on 31.1.2006. Recruitment is a continuous process and therefore, no time frame can be fixed for the same.

Recruitment from North Eastern Region in Railways

2527. SHRI KARNENDU BHATTACHARJEE: Will the Minister of RAILWAYS be pleased to state:

(a) whether it is a fact that Government are giving priority for development of the North Eastern Region;

(b) if so, whether the priority would be given for candidates coming from North Eastern Zone by N.F. Railway; and

(c) if so, the details thereof, category-wise and if not, the reasons therefor?

THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF RAILWAYS (SHRI NARAINBHAI RATHWA): (a) Yes Sir.

(b) and (c) Direct recruitment of Group 'C' posts on Indian Railway is made by Railway Recruitment Boards (RRBs) within their respective jurisdiction. Candidates from any part of the country are free to apply in response to advertisement issued by any of the RRBs. Since Railways are an AH India organization serving as an effective instrument of national integration, no discrimination or favour is done against or for any candidate on the basis of his place of residence. Selections are basically done on the basis of merit position of the candidates in the respective examination.
