

SCHEME TO END CORRUPTION

*228. SHRI NIRANJAN SINGH: Will the Minister of HOME AFFAIRS be pleased to state:

(a) whether any scheme to end corruption was formulated at the Joint Conference of State Anti-Corruption Departments and Officers of the Central Bureau of Investigation which was held recently in Delhi; and

(b) if so, what are the particulars of that scheme?

THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF HOME AFFAIRS (SHRI R. M. HAJARNAVIS): (a) and (b). The Conference was not called to formulate any general scheme to end corruption, but to consider a number of practical problems relating to the working of the anti-corruption agencies both at the Centre and in the States, and to examine the difficulties experienced in their day-to-day work and to devise ways and means for overcoming them.
