DISPUTE BETWEEN U.P. AND M.P. OVER SHARING OF POWER FROM RIHAND DAM PROJECT

*132 SHRI R. S. KHANDEKAR: Will the Minister of Home Affairs be pleased to state the latest position regarding the settlement of the dispute between Uttar Pradesh and Madhya Pradesh over the sharing of power from the Rihand Dam Project?

THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE OF HOME AFFAIRS MINISTRY (SHRI R. M. HAJARNAVIS): A settlement between the Governments of Uttar Pradesh and Madhya Pradesh in regard to the supply of power from Rihand Dam Project was reached at the last meeting of the Central Zonal Council held at Nainital on Ist and 2nd July, 1963.

SHRI R. S. KHANDEKAR: May I know, Sir, since the Madnya Pradesh Government had threatened to take this matter up to the Supreme Court, whether all the outstanding disputes between the two States with regard to these dams have been solved, or are there still any outstanding disputes?

SHRI LAL BAHADUR: There is no dispute at all both in regard to the Rihand dam and the Mata Dila dam.

Shri N. SRI RAMA REDDY: May I know how the allocation has been made between Madhya Pradesh and U.P.?

SHRI LAL BAHADUR: The U.P. Electricity Board will make available to Madhya Pradesh 15 per cent of power based on the energy available at Rihand dam. In regard to Mata Dila dam, one-third of the power based on the energy available at Mata Dila from year to year will be made available by the Electricity Board.

SHRI R. S. KHANDEKAR: May I know when these benefits will accrue to the Madhya Pradesh Government and the Uttar Pradesh Government? When will this settlement come into effect?

SHRI LAL BAHADUR: I think as early as possible.

Shri CHANDRA SHEKHAR: Is it a fact that the scheme was taken in hand mainly to provide power to the agriculturists in Eastern U.P., for industrial and agricultural development, but contrary to the objectives of the scheme the U. P. Government had provided a large portion of the power produced to Birlas and the agriculturists had to pay much more than the Birlas?

SHRI LAL BAHADUR: Undoubtedly the electricity or power to be supplied from Rihand Dam is meant for

supply of electricity as well as water for irrigation purposes. But the hon. Member is fully aware of the fact that U.P. has practically no new big industries except for the old cotton mills in Kanpur. U. P. has been perhaps the most backward State in that respect as compared to the States. So, the State Government did agree to supply power to aluminium plant which were set up at Mirzapur near the Rihand Dam. However, the hon Member will be glad to know that a licence has been issued or Government have agreed to give a captive plant grant to the party concerned. In that case the electricity will be released, the power will be released and it will be utilised both for industries as well as for agriculture.

Shri ARJUN ARORA: May I know if it is a fact that all the electrical energy needed for energising tubewells in Eastern U. P. has been provided by the power generated at Rihand Dam?

SHRI LAL BAHADUR: That is so.

SHRI R. S. KHANDEKAR: May I know whether apart from these people the Railways are getting any benefit from the electricity generated by them?

SHRI LAL BAHADUR: Yes, Rail-ways are also being helped.

SHRI CHANDRA SHEKHAR: The hon. Home Minister did not reply to the second part of my question. Is it a fact that Birlas get cheaper power than the agriculturists? If it is so, may I know why this concession is given to Birlas?

MR. CHAIRMAN: The rate of bulk purchase may be different from the other purchases.

SHRI LAL BAHADUR: Yes, the rate is different. If the aluminium industry has to exist, generally it is given on concessional rates, because its consumption is terribly high.
