EMPLOYEES' STATE INSURANCE SCHEME

- *130. SHRI BABUBHAI M. CHINAI: Will the Minister of LABOUR AND EMPLOYMENT be pleased to state:
- (a) the areas and industries which are not covered so far by the Emplovees' State Insurance Scheme; and
- (b) by when these areas and industries are likely to be covered?

THE DEPUTY MINISTER IN THE MINISTRY OF LABOUR AND EM-PLOYMENT AND FOR PLANNING (SHRI C. R. PATTABHI RAMAN): and (b) The Employees' State Insurance Act, 1948, does not discriminate between industries. The Act applies at present to perennial factories, using power and in which 20 or more persons are working. A statement giving names of areas not yet covered with insurable strength of over 500 employees is laid on the Table. [See Appendix XLII, Annexure No. 6]. It is proposed to cover these areas by the end of the Third Plan.

AMERICAN EXPERTS' ADVICE ON INTERNAL PUBLICITY

- *131. SHRI BHUPESH GUPTA: Will the Minister of Information and Broadcasting be pleased to state:
- (a) whether it is a fact that an American team of experts headed by Dr. Wilbur Schramm is scheduled to visit India to advise Government on internal publicity; and
- (b) if so, what are the special reasons for which such advice is sought from foreign experts?

THE MINISTER OF INFORMATION AND BROADCASTING (Dr. B. GOPALA REDDI): (a) and (b) The Ford Foundation offered to bring a Team of Experts at their expense to make an over-all study of the problem of Mass Communication. The offer was accepted for the limited purpose of formulating a scheme for setting up an Institute for training in the techniques of Mass Communication. Accordingly,

a Team of Experts, headed by Dr. Wilbur Schramm has visited India to formulate such a scheme, but not to advise Government on internal publicity.

THE DEPUTY MINISTER IN THE MINISTRY OF EXTERNAL AFFAIRS (SHRI DINESH SINGH): The numbers of armed raids by the Naga rebels are as follows:—

THE MINISTER OF DEFENCE (SHRT Y. B. CHAVAN): (a) It is proposed to start a college for training women NCC officers. It would be located at Gwalior in Madhya Pradesh if a suitable building is available there.

(b) and (c) No building has so far been acquired for this purpose. The college will be oened after a suitable building becomes available.
