and claims are invariably filed where there is a claim.

SHRI BHUPESH GUPTA: You will remember, Sir, that the Minister said in this House the other day that the safety of our Railways was as good as in the United Kingdom, if not better. May I know, in order to have ,a comparative study how many people had been killed as a result of railway accidents in England during the current year since he gave comparisons?

SHRI SHAH NAWAZ KHAN: Yes, Sir. We have all the figures, and if the hon. Member would like to know the whole thing, I can tell him after the Question Hour.

Additional Engineering Division for Orissa P. & T. Circle

•393. SHRI LOKANATH MISRA: "Will the Minister of TRANSPORT AND COMMUNICATIONS be pleased to state:

 (a) whether a proposal to sanction
•one additional Engineering Division and three additional Sub-divisions to the Orissa Post and Telegraph Circle is under Government's consideration; and

(b) if so, when the proposal is likely to be given effect to?

THE MINISTER OF TRANSPORT AND COMMUNICATIONS (DR. P. SUBBARAYAN): (a) Yes. A proposal has been received from the Director, Posts and Telegraphs, Orissa.

(b) The question of re-organisation of teleoommunications in this area is under examination. A decision is likely to be taken shortly.

SHRI LOKANATH MISRA: Did the Deputy Director-General in his official •Observations also recommend the formation of such Sub-divisions and Divisions? DR. P. SUBBARAYAN: It relates to more than one State. Therefore, the D.G., P. & T. is actively considering what could be done.

SHRI LOKANATH MISRA: After his tour of Orissa, did he recommend the formation of a Sub-division or Division?

DR. P. SUBBARAYAN; Yes, Sir, that was done. But it is under consideration, as I have said.

SANCTION OF SELECTION GRADE STENO-GRAPHERS TO DIRECTORS OF POSTS AND TELEGRAPHS

*394. SHRI LOKANATH MISRA: Will the Minister of TRANSPORT AND COMMUNICATIONS be pleased to state:

(a) whether a proposal to sanction selection grade stenographers to the Directors of Posts and Telegraphs and officers of equivalent rank is under the consideration of Government since about a year; and

(b) if so, when is the proposal likely to materialise?

THE MINISTER OF TRANSPORT AND COMMUNICATIONS (Dr. P. SUBBARAYAN): (a) NO.

(b) Does not arise.

SHRI LOKANATH MISRA; In view of the fact that the Pay Commission in paragraphs 40 and 41 of its report has said that a higher grade, that is, Rs. 210-Rs. 425 should be given to those officers of the subordinate service . . .

DR. P. SUBBARAYAN: It has been examined by the Ministry of Finance.

SHRI LOKANATH MISRA: This is in connection with stenographers. The higher grade that is, Rs. 210 to Rs. 425, should be given to those officers of the subordinate service whose duties an<i responsibilities are broadly comparable to those given to the Deputy

Secretaries to the Government. The duties and responsibilities should not be the main criterion . . .

MR. DEPUTY CHAIRMAN; What •is your question?

SHRI LOKANATH MJSRA: This is "what the Pay Commission has recommended.

MR. DEPUTY CHAIRMAN: The matter is under the examination of the Finance Ministry.

SHRI LOKANATH MISRA: He said that there was no proposal for sanction.

DR. P. SUBBARAYAN: The Pav 'Commission have not specifically recommended that the stenographers attached to the Directors, P. & T. should be in the scale of Rs. 210/425 ibut since they have observed that the stenographers attached to the officers whose duties and responsibilities are comparable to those of the Deputy Secretaries of the Government should fbe in the scale of Rs. 210/425, the D. G., P. & T., has taken up the proposal that the pay of the stenographers •attached to the Directors, P. & T., whose duties and responsibilities are comparable to those of a Deputy Secretary of Government of India, should be in the scale of Rs. 210/425 as against Rs. 130/300, the present scale. The proposal is being examin-ed by the Ministry of Finance. No final decision has so far been taken in the matter, but from the trend of discussions in the Ministry of Finance, no really favourable decision is expected.
