

**DEATH OF WORKERS OF GAUHATI OIL  
REFINERY**

\*90. SHRI LILA DHAR BAROOAH.  
"Will the Minister of MINES AND FUEL be pleased to state-

(a) whether Government's attention has been drawn to the death under mysterious circumstances of two workers of Gauhati Oil Refinery recently;

(b) whether any enquiry was made by the Refinery authorities into the circumstances of these deaths; and

(c) whether any compensation has been paid to the families of the deceased?

THE MINISTER OF MINES AND FUEL (SHRI K. D. MALAVIYA) : (a) and (b) Yes, Sir. The death was accidental.

(c) An *ex-gratia* payment of Rs. 1000 each was made to the families of the deceased, pending determination of actual amount of compensation under the Workmen's Compensation Act.

**COUNTRY-MADE BOMBS, LOADED PISTOLS  
ETC. FOUND IN DELHI SUBURB**

\*92. SHRI FARIDUL HAQ ANSARI: Will the Minister of HOME AFFAIRS be pleased to state:

(a) whether it is a fact that the Delhi police had unearthed several country-made bombs, loaded pistols, live cartridges, long knives and other material used in bomb manufacture, in a suburb of Delhi sometimes in the end of July, 1962;

(b) if so, whether any investigation was carried out in that connection; and

(c) if so, what was the result of the investigation?

THE MINISTER OF STATE AN THE MINISTRY OF HOME AFFAIRS (SHRI B. N. DATAR) : (a) and (b) Yes.

(c) Four persons who were arrested in this connection have since been challaned. While one of them has

been convicted under the Arms Act, the cases of the remaining three are *sub-judice*.

**ALLOCATION TO STATES FOR CONDUCTING

(a) whether the Government of India has made allocations to the States 'for conducting students' tours in the country; and

(b) if so, what is the amount given to each State and what is the purpose of such tours?

THE MINISTER OF EDUCATION (DR. K. L. SHRIMALI) : (a) Yes, Sir.

(b) A statement showing amount given to each State during the current year is placed below. The purpose of these tours is to enable students to enlarge their outlook and supplement their knowledge by visits to places of national and historical importance and scenic beauty.
