

Selection of Personnel.—The selection of personnel to be invited will largely depend on local needs and the exigencies of work in the Faculty or Department concerned. This will, therefore, be left solely to the discretion of the universities. After the negotiations are finalised the universities may write to the Commission and formal invitations will then be issued by the Commission to the people concerned.

Duration of the Visit.—The duration of the visit depend on the nature and scope of the subject on which the Visiting Professor or Expert has consented to speak, and also the time for which he can be spared by the institution he serves. Long visits may not be feasible or convenient. We may in the first instance encourage brief visits (for a short course of lectures), and limit the cost by fixing one month as the maximum period for which financial assistance shall be available from the Commission. The Visiting Professor or Expert shall be deemed to be on duty for the period covered by his travel and stay at the host institution. This will of course be subject to the agreement of the "institution being served by the Visiting Professor or Expert.

Functions of the Visiting Professor or Expert.—The services of the Visiting Professor or Expert may be utilised (a) to deliver a course of lectures on a subject in which he has specialised, (b) to conduct seminars or participate in the discussions, and (c) to offer advice or guidance to research workers and the members of the Faculty.
