MINISTER THE OF INTERNA-TIONAL TRADE IN THE MINISTRY OF COMMERCE INDUS-AND TRY (Shri MANUBHAI SHAH): (a) Yes, Sir. But generally only representatives of the interests concerned are invited by the Commission to attend these meetings.

(b) Normally from 11 A.M. to 5.30 P.M., with one hour's break for lunch.

(c) Ad hoc discussions are sometimes held by the Commission with groups or interests concerned in the case of important inquiries.

PRODUCTION OF BOOKS WITH FOREIGN COLLABORATION

New Horizons Private Ltd., New Delhi to establish a company in India 'n colloboration with M/s. Thomson Organisation Ltd., U.K. for the printing, publication and distribution of books, which will be primarily scientific, technical and other standard text-books. M/s. New Horizons Private Ltd., have since proposed that in the event of any spare un-utilised capacity of the machinery being available, the Indian Company may also be allowed to undertake such work and/or which helps to earn save proposal is foreign exchange. ## BROADCASTS FROM CALCUTTA STATION OF A.I.R.

\*933. SHRI RAM PRASANNA RAY: Will the Minister of INFORMATIOA AND BROADCASTING be pleased to state:

(a) whether Government are aware that Calcutta Station of All India Radio broadcasts, even on shortwave bands, are not audible in Delhi; and

(b) if so, what steps are proposed to be taken to make broadcasts by Calcutta Station audible in Delhi?

THE MINISTER OF INFORMATION AND BROADCASTING (DR. B. GOPALA REDDI): (a) Yes, Sir.

(b) The service from Calcutta has been planned on regional basis like other centres of All India Radio and is not expected to provide an all-India coverage.
