SECOND BANDUNG CONFERENCE

SHRI N. M. LINGAM:

Will the PRIME MINISTER be pleased to state:

(a) whether there is any proposal to convene a Second Bandung Conference; and

(b) if so, who are the sponsors of this Conference?

THE PRIME MINISTER AND MINISTER OF EXTERNAL AFFAIRS (SHRI JAWAHARLAL NEHRU): (a) and (b) The idea of holding a second Bandung has been pursued by some Afro-Asian countries over the past few years. Recently some of the concerned countries, including India, have been sounded again in th's regard. The matter has not so far reached the sponsoring stage.

PUBLICITY MATERIAL ISSUED BY P.I.B.

(a) what steps are being taken by the Government to increase the nature and scope of Hindi publicity material;

(b) in how many Indian languages the Government are issuing their puDlicity material and the places from where it is being issued; and

(c) what steps are being taken to see that publicity material is being issued in all the major Indian languages?

THE DEPUTY MINISTER IN THE MINISTRY OF INFORMATION AND BROADCASTING (SHRI SHAM NATH): (a) It is proposed to expand and speed up the supply of Hindi publicity material by opening more distribution offices in Hindi-speaking regions which will be linked with the Headquarters of the Press Information Bureau by Hindi teleprinters.

(b) and (c) Publicity material is being issued in 12 Indian languages as detailed below: —
