

THE MINISTER OF STEEL AND HEAVY INDUSTRIES (SHRI C. SUBRAMANIAM): (a) M/s. Hind Traders, Bombay, were granted an industrial licence in December, 1960 for manufacture of pig iron up to 96,000 tons per annum. The firm proposes to use a specialised process of smelting using non-coking coal, which is under technical examination at present. After the successful conclusion of the tests, orders for plant and machinery would be placed and construction of the factory undertaken. They have been given extension of time up to 10 th December, 1962 for taking 'effective steps'.

(b) Besides, Government have also licensed another firm, M/s. Birla, Gwalior, Private Limited, for the manufacture of 100,000 tons of pig iron in Chanda District.

(SHRIMATI MARAGATHAM CHANDRASB-KHAR) : (a) to (d) The Government of India have not opened any training centre under the Banaras University for giving training to candidates belonging to Scheduled Castes/Tribes for the I.A.S. and I.P.S. examination. However, such a centre is functioning under the University of Allahabad.
