

**LONG QUEUES BEFORE DELHI MILK SCHEMES BOOTHS**

913. SHRI R. N. KAKATI: Will the Minister of FOOD AND AGRICULTURE be pleased to state:

(a) whether he is aware of the fact that people have to wait for a long time in "Queue" to get milk from the booths of the Delhi Milk Scheme; and

(b) if so, what steps have been taken to remedy this state of affairs?

THE DEPUTY MINISTER IN THE MINISTRY OF FOOD (SHRI A. M. THOMAS): (a) There is very keen demand for the milk sold by the Delhi Milk Scheme because of its good quality and reasonable price. Moreover, every one wants to get it as early as possible. There is, therefore, a rush when the milk depots open each morning and afternoon and consumers queue up to obtain their requirements.

(b) (1) New depots are opened when the volume of sales is more than 800 bottles of milk daily at one depot; and

(2) Till the new depots begin to operate, additional staff is deployed to accelerate the pace of sale of milk in these depots.

**DRAINAGE SYSTEM IN THE CAPITAL**

(a) whether it is a fact that some arrangements are being made to improve the drainage system in the Capital;

(b) if so, what are those arrangements; and

THE MINISTER OF HEALTH (DR. SUSHILA NAYAR): (a) Yes.

(b) and (c) Under the Third Five Year Plan, some schemes are being executed. A statement indicating the schemes and the likely dates of completion is attached.
