ORAL ANSWERS TO QUESTIONS

ARMS CAPTURED FROM HOSTILE NAGAS

•250. SHRI FARIDUL HAQ AN-"SARI:
With the PRIME MINISTER be -pleased to state:

(a) whether it is a fact that some
arms have recently been captured from
hostile Nagas on the Nagaland-Mani-Ir border;
and

(b) if so, what was the origin of
these arms?

THE DEPUTY MINISTER OF EXTERNAL
AFFAIRS (SHRIMATI LAKSHMI MENON): (a)
Yes; during \ raid on a Naga hostile camp on
the 28th February, 1961, a h&ht machine gun,
a sten gun, 8 rifles and one muzzle loading
gun were captured.

(b) Some of these weapons were found to
be of British, American and Japanese origin,
manufactured during the II World War. Some
others were of Indian origin. The muzzle
loading gun was found to be locally made.

I SHRI FARIDUL HAQ ANSARI: May I
know whether the Government has made any
enquiry as to how these people came to
possess these arms?

SHRIMATI LAKSHMI MENON: Sir, a large
number of these weapons are captured from
the hostiles. They are found to be of wartime
origin, from the abandoned dumps. It is
believed that this source is not completely
exhausted. Then the hostiles have also
captured some weapons of 166 RS—1.

recent manufacture from our security forces
operating among them.

SHRI FARIDUL HAQ ANSARI: Are the
arms that they have got from our security
forces small in number or large in number?

SHRIMATI LAKSHMI MENON: Sir, they
are 303 rifles—five of them.

SHRI JASWANT SINGH: I would like to
know whether these arms are obsolete or they
can still be used.

SHRIMATI LAKSHMI MENON: Evidently
they can be used. Otherwise they would not
have them.

SHRI BHUPESH GUPTA: Sir, it seems that
some foreigners, especially the British people,
can easily go there. And recently, Sir, a letter
appeared in the Observer

SHRIMATI LAKSHMI MENON: Sir, that
does not arise out of this question. This deals
with a particular raid.

MR. CHAIRMAN: He is bringing the raid
indirectly.

SHRI BHUPESH GUPTA: Sir, recently a
letter has appeared in which a British
journalist writes that he went there, had
discussions with the Naga rebels and he wrote
in the *Observer* also that he discussed the
question of getting the pilots who had been
arrested released and so on. Does it not follow
from this that some of these people, who so
frequently go there, can also take part in
making arms available to the Nagas,
especially when we know that Phizo is in
London?

SHRIMATI LAKSHMI MENON: Sir, that
is not a question.

MR. CHAIRMAN: It is not a question
which she can answer.

SHRI BHUPESH GUPTA: Sir, I do not
know how to make it a question, Well. Sir.
has it occurred

to the Government, to her or to the Prime Minister, that such visits might have something to do with making arrangements for the supply of this kind of arms?

SHRIMATI LAKSHMI MENON: No, Sir. This particular journalist that he refers to went not with arms or anything else but just to interview somebody there.

SHRI A. D. MANI: Were the Indian weapons that were captured of recent origin or of wartime origin?

SHRIMATI LAKSHMI MENON: It is not known, Sir, whether the five rifles, which have been mentioned, are of wartime origin or of recent origin. They are made in the Ishapore factory.

श्री राम सहाय : करीब दो महीने का अर्सा हुआ जब कि समाचारपत्रों में इस प्रकार का समाचार छपा था कि जिन पोस्ट्स पर चाइनीज ने कब्जा कर लिया था वे वहां से बहुत ठंड की वजह से और मौसम खराब होने की वजह से पीछे हट गये हैं। क्या यह ठीक है ?

SHRIMATI LAKSHMI MENON: Yes, Sir, according to our information, the Chinese withdrew from their check-posts across Ladakh and Nepal.

SHRI MAHESWAR NAIK: What w the present position of Longju? On account of the prevalence of epidemic* it had been vacated. May I know whether the Chinese have reoccupied it?

SHRIMATI LAKSHMI MENON: It has already been stated in thi* House that the Chinese had vacated Longju. Of course, we do not know whether it has been reoccupied.

SHRI MAHESWAR NAIK: May I know whether the Government ia taking any steps to reoccupy Longju?

SHRIMATI LAKSHMI MENON: That answer was given here. We have no intention of taking it just-now.

SHRI SATYACHARAN: May I know, Sir, whether Longju legally belongs to us and, if so, why has it not been occupied by our Government after its vacation by the Chinese?
