

PRODUCTION OF GUAR-GUM

372. SHRI JUGAL KISHORE: Will the Minister of COMMERCE AND INDUSTRY be pleased to state:

(a) the quantity of guar-gum produced in India during the year 1959-60 and so far in 1961; and

(b) whether it is true that M/s Birla Brothers have applied to Government for the expansion of their guar-gum factory at Bhiwani?

THE MINISTER OF INDUSTRY (SHRI MANUBHAI SHAH): (a) The following quantity of guar-gum was produced in India:

1959	6,200 tons
1960	7,600 tons
1961	(January-July)	4,820 tons

(b) M/s. Birla Brothers have been permitted to set up a new unit at Bhiwani, under the name and style of M/s Hindustan Gum and Chemicals Ltd., to manufacture Refined mannagalaetan (Gaur-Gum), in addition to the existing unit viz. M/s. Bhiwani Guar & Gum Factory. The total capacity of these two units will remain the same as already licensed to M/s. Bhiwani Guar & Gum.
