THE MINISTER OF AGRICULTURE (Dr. P. S. DESHMUKH): (a) to (c) Information is being collected from the States concerned and will be laid on the Table of the Sabha as soon as received.

## RAIL LINK TO JAMMU CITY

- \*540. SHRI P. N. RAJABHOJ: Will the Minister of Railways be pleased to state:
- (a) whether Government propose to open a rail link to Jammu City;and
- (b) if so, when the work is expected to be completed and at what stage of implementation it is at present?

THE DEPUTY MINISTER OF RAIL-WAYS (SHRI S. V. RAMASWAMY):
(a) and (b) The proposal is under examination by the Railway Board.

## COST OF SUGARCANE PRODUCTION

- \*545. SHRI D. B. DESAI: Will the Minister of FOOD AND AGRICULTURE be pleased to state:
- (a) what is the cost of production of sugarcane in the States of Maharashtra, Madras and Mysore;
- (b) whether Government have taken any measures to reduce this cost; and
  - (c) if so, what are those measures?

THE DEPUTY MINISTER OF AGRI-CULTURE (SHRI M. V. KRISHNAPPA): (a) No reliable data regarding exact cost of production of sugarcane in the

- States of Maharashtra, Madras and Mysore are available at present.
- (b) and (c) Yes, Sir. With a view to lay a sound foundation for the economic production of sugarcane from the smallest possible area, schemes for development of sugarcane have been introduced in various States.

HOSPITALS FOR EMPLOYEES OF GOV-ERNMENT UNDERTAKINGS AT RANCHI

- \*558. Shri P. C. MITRA: Will the Minister of Health be pleased to state:
- (a) whether he is aware that different Central Government undertakings situated within the limits of Ranchi town are having separate hospitals or dispensaries for treatment of their employees; and
- (b) whether there is any proposal under Government's consideration to have co-ordination between them to save overhead expenditure?

- (a) whether it is a fact that the railway employees of the Northern Railway when transferred from one Division to another Division of the same Railway, at their own request, are not given the benefit of their previous service;
- (b) whether it is a fact that a number of goods clerks recruited for Jodhpur Division in the years 1953,

1954 and 1955 and transferred to Delhi Division in August, 1958 at their own request, have been given the benefit of their previous service and placed senior to those who were appointed in 1947;

- (c) whether Government have received any representation from the goods clerks in this regard;
- (d) if so, what action Government have taken in the matter, and
- (e) what are the reasons for which other Railway employees are not given the benefit of their previous service when transferred to other Divisions at their requests?

THE DEPUTY MINISTER OF RAIL-WAYS (SHRI S. V. RAMASWAMY): (a) Yes, for the purpose of seniority pnly.

- (b) The transfers referred to were ordered on administrative grounds.
- (c) and (d) Yes, the representation is under consideration.
- (e) The present practice safeguards the interest of staff already working in the Division to which transfer is sought; further it helps in keeping down the number of requests for transfers.

RENEWAL OF LEASE-DEEDS OF LEASE-HOLD PROPERTIES IN NEW DELHI

- \*560, Shri A. C. GILBERT: Will the Minister of Health be pleased to state:
- (a) whether it is a fact that a large number of lease-deeds of lease-hold properties in the New Delhi area, the lease-terms of which have since expired, have not so far been renewed;
- (b) if so, what is the number of such cases and what are the reasons for which the lease terms have not been renewed; and

(c) when the lease-terms of such cases are likely to be renewed?
