STATEMENT

The Ministry of Railways have issued orders laying down that, for purposes of seniority, the medically unfitted staff who are absorbed in other categories should be placed below those who are in receipt of the same rate of pay in the grade on the date of their absorption.

There are also other staff who may not be specifically medically unfitted but in whose cases the medical authorities may advise that they should be transferred to some other post in the interest of the administration as well as in the interest of the individuals. In regard to this category of staff, no specific orders have been issued by the Ministry of Railways. Each Railway is following its own practice.

In regard to those staff who seek transfer to other jobs of their own accord (supported by a medical certificate), the practice which is followed on the Railways is generally that they are placed below all permanent and officiating employees on the date of their absorption in the grade.

ROAD RAILERS

On National Highways, a bridge across the Jamuna, near Humayun's Tomb, in Delhi, is under construction. On roads other than National Highways, three more Bridges across the Jamuna river have also been sanctioned with Central Government assistance. (i) at Paonta, in Himachal Pradesh, (ii) at Kairana, in U. P. and (iii) at Wazirabad near Delhi.

The last-mentioned bridge is already under construction.
