DEPARTMENT OF DISINVESTMENT (SHRI ARUN SHOURIE): (a) and (b) Planning and development of an area and allocation of funds for the purpose are primarily the responsibility of the concerned State Government. However, the Central Government supplements the efforts of the State Governments through weightage for backwardness in the formula used for distribution of normal Central Assistance. Further, Special Central Assistance is allocated under Special Area Programmes such as Hill Areas Development Programme etc. to meet the special problems of designated areas. In addition certain other area programmes such as Drought Prone Area Programme (DPAP), Desert Development Programme (DDP) and Integrated Wastelands Development Project (IWDP) are in operation to mitigate the development problems of identified areas.
