INDIAN REPRESENTATIVE'S STAND AT THE
EMERGENCY SESSION OF THE U.N.
GENERAL ASSEMBLY ON CONGO

*136. SHRI BHUPESH GUPTA: Will the PRIME MINISTER be pleased to state:

(a) what position was taken by India's representative, Shri C. S. Jha *vis a vis* the emergency Session of the United Nations General Assembly to consider the Congo issue;

(b) what position was taken by him in regard to the role of the United Nations Secretary-General, Mr. Dag Hammarskjold, in relation to the developments in Congo; and

(c) whether he will lay on the Table of the House a copy of Shri Jha's speech on the Afro-Asian resolution on Congo?

THE DEPUTY MINISTER OF EXTERNAL AFFAIRS (SHRIMATI LAKSHMI MENON): (a) Shri C. S. Jha, India's Permanent Representative to the United Nations, supported United Nations action in the Congo, which was undertaken by the Security Council at the request of the Central Government of the Republic of the Congo.

(b) While supporting the action of the United Nations in the Congo, Shri Jha did not make any specific mention of the role of the U.N. Secretary-General, Mr. Dag Hammarskjold, in regard to the developments in the Congo.

(c) A copy of the text of Shri Jha's statement on the Afro-Asian resolution on the Congo, made during the Special U.N. Session, has been placed on the Table of the House.
