159. SHRI B. N. BHARGAVA: Will the Minister of FOOD AND AGRICULTURE be pleased to state the number of Village Extension Centres established under the Key Village Scheme in each State during the Second Five Year Plan as against the target fixed?

THE DEPUTY MINISTER OF AGRI-CULTURE (SHRI M. V. KRISHNAPPA): A target for the establishment of 72 Key Village Extension Centres was fixed under the Second Five Year Plan on the basis of Working Group discussions and the funds allocated by them to the States. As against this, 67 Centres have been established so far as per state-wise details in the appended statement.

THE PARLIAMENTARY SECRE-TARY TO THE MINISTER OF COMMU-NITY DEVELOPMENT AND CO-OPE-RATION (SHRI S. D. MISRA): (a) and (b) All the State Governments have accepted and are implementing recommendation regarding the establishment of a Primary Health Centre and 3 maternity sub-centres in each block. The progress achieved in implementing the recommendation is subject to the limiting factor, viz., availability of suffic ent trained personnel for staffing them. Even effort is being made to augment the existing training institutions and provide additional training facilities to meet the increasing demands for personnel.

# RESEARCH MULTIPLICATION AND DISTRI-BUTION OF IMPROVED VARIETIES OF OILSEEDS

163. SHRI B. N. BHARGAVA: Will the Minister of Food and Agriculture be pleased to refer to paragraph 22 on page 46 of the Report of the Ministry of Food and Agriculture (Department of Agriculture) for 1959-60 and state the names of the States where the Schemes for research, multiplication and distribution of improved varieties of oilseeds are financed by the Central Government?

THE MINISTER OF AGRICULTURE (DR. P. S. DESHMUKH): The Government of India are financing Oilseed Development Schemes in the States of Andhra Pradesh, Gujarat, Madras, Orissa and Uttar Pradesh, the functions of which include, among others, multiplication and/or distribution of improved varieties of oilseeds.

Schemes for technological research on vegetable oilseeds and oils, are also being financed by the Government of India, through the Indian Central Oilseeds Comm ttee, in the States of Andhra Pradesh, Uttar Pradesh and Maharashtra.

In addition, Schemes for research, multiplication and distribution of improved varieties of oilseeds are being financed by the Indian Central Oilseeds Committee from the cess funds in the States of Andhra Pradesh, Assam, Bihar, Gujarat, Maharashtra, Kerala, Madras, Madhya Pradesh, Mysore, Orissa, Punjab, Rajasthan, Uttar Pradesh, West Bengal and Himachal Pradesh.

## TRAINING OF TECHNICAL PERSONNEL AT PILOT PAPER PLANT

164. Shri B. N. BHARGAVA: Will the Minister of Food and Agriculture be pleased to state the number of technical personnel receiving training in the Pilot Paper Plant established at the Forest Research Institute, Dehra Dun?
