t[THE DEPUTY MINISTER OF RAILWAYS (SHRI SHAH NAWAZ KHAN) : A statement is laid on the Table of the House.

STATEMENT

(1) The loss suffered by the railways as a result of the recent strike is roughly estimated at about Rs. 3-7 crores. This covers reduction in traffic receipts, temporary set hack in production, loss due to sabotage and expenditure on emergency arrangements.

(2) Rails were found removed at one place, on a bridge near Radha-nagar on the South Eastern Railway and the two rails had been thrown at this place down the embankment. In addition, according to data available so far at ten places indicated below, attempts were made to tamper with the line by removing fishplates, fishbolts etc.
