## STATEMENT

- (1) The loss suffered by the railways as a result of the recent strike is roughly estimated at about Rs. 3.7 crores. This covers reduction in traffic receipts, temporary set back in production, loss due to sabotage and expenditure on emergency arrangements.
- (2) Rails were found removed at one place, on a bridge near Radhanagar on the South Eastern Railway and the two rails had been thrown at this place down the embankment. In addition, according to data available so far at ten places indicated below. attempts were made to tamper with the line by removing fishplates, fishbolts etc.
