SHRI K. K. SHAH*: [SHRI M. M. MEHTA:

Will the Minister of RAILWAYS be-pleased to state:

(b) whether there have been instances of first class bogies running, without the full complement of passengers from New Delhi railway station;

(b) whether Government have received any complaints from the public to the effect that they have been denied accommodation in spite of the fact that seats were vacant *at the time of departure; and

(c) if so, what action has been taken by Government on these complaints?

THE DEPUTY MINISTER OF RAILWAYS (SHRI SHAH NAWAZ KHAN): (a) Yes. Accommodation goes vacant from starting stations for a variety of reasons, such as reservations from intermediate stations, passengers due by connecting trains not turning up or last minute cancellations.

(b) None in regard to New Delhi.

(c) Does not arise.

SHRI K. K. SHAH: Is the Minister aware that in the intermediate stations reservations are not granted till the last day, and sometimes intimation is received at the time when the train steams into the platform?

SHRI SHAH NAWAZ KHAN: That is not our information, Sir.
