THE MINISTER OF INDUSTRY (SHRI MANUBHAI SHAH): (a) The National Small Industries Corporation which is an autonomous Government Company registered under the Companies Act is already operating schemes for rendering marketing assistance to small industries in the country. Market News Service is rendered by the Organisation of the Development Commissioner (Small Scale Industries). There is no proposal for establishing a new Marketing Service Corporation and a Marketing News Service.
