RISE IN THE PRICES OF COTTON TEXTILES

*339. Dr. Z. A. AHMAD: Will the Minister of COMMERCE AND INDUSTRY be pleased to refer to the answer given to Starred Question No. 38 in the Rajya Sabha on the 10th February, 1960, and state:

- (a) whe her it is a fact that prices of cotton textiles have rising sharply in recent months;
- (b) if so, what is the extent of rise of different varieties of cotton cloth as compared to the position for last 3 years;
- (c) what are the reasons for this rise in prices; and
- (d) what steps Government have taken to bring down the cloth prices?

чн. MINISTER OF COMMERCE (SHRI N. KANUNGO); (a) to (d). A note giving the required information is laid on the Table of the House.

STATEMENT

- (a) Yes, Sir.
- (b) Cotton textile prices which were high in 1956 declined after imposition of higher excise levy in September 1956 and remained more or less steady till middle of 1959. Prices have been showing an upward trend from August 1959. The extent increase varies from variety to variey and from mill to mill; it has generally risen by about 40 per cent. in the coarse and lower medium variety and smaller margin for the varieties.
- (c) The increase is attributable to increase in the price of cotton, higher wages and also to speculative activity in certain quarters.
- (d) Government have allowed adeincluding quate imports of cotton short-staple cotton to meet the requirements of the industry. ernment have urged 'he industry to bring down prices and keep them under check by opening retail shops and displaying price lists prominently. The Industry have promised to cooperate and are already taking certain steps.

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
