MINERAL ADVISORY BOARD

(b) The Board considered the various recommendations made by the Committee and expressed its views on them except on two items relating to establishment of a National Ore Dressing Laboratory and evolving of a positive mineral policy for which the Board suggested formation of ad hoc committee to go into the matter in greater detail.

(c) The views expressed by the Board and its recommendations are under consideration of the Government and decisions will be taken as soon as possible.

OIL FIELD FOUND NEAR AGRA

(a) whether it is a fact that the Agra police have recently discovered an oil-field near Balkeshwar on the bank of the Jamuna; and

(SHRI K. D. MALAVIYA): (a) and (b) A statement giving the required information is laid on the Table of the House.

STATEMENT

On receipt of a message from the State authorities on 8th August, 1960, the Oil and Natural Gas Commission were asked to investigate the alleged oil show on Jamuna Bank near Balkeshwar Temple about five miles from Agra. Two Technical Officers of the Commission visited the site and collected samples of sand and oil. The results of the examination of these samples and the geological associations of the oil show are such that the occurrence of natural hydrocarbons in the area appears to be improbable. The matter will be investigated further by the Oil and Natural Gas Commission after the rains.
