## ECONOMY IN EXECUTION OF RIVER VALLEY PROJECTS

13. SHRI MAHESWAR NAIK: Will the Minister of IRRIGATION AND POWER be pleased to state whether it is a fact that the State Governments and the authorities in charge of river valley projects are offering a mixed recep tion to the proposals made by the Economy Committee for adoption of measures in the execution of various river valley projects leading to sub stantial savings, and if so, for what reasons?

THE DEPUTY MINISTER OF IRRI-GATION AND POWER (SHRI J. S, L. HATHI): Presumably the Hon Member refers to the recommendations made by the departmental Study Group which was set up by the Ministry of Irrigation and Power in 1956 to study the various factors for promoting efficiency and economy in the Irrigation and Power sector. As irrigation and power projects are being executed directly by the State Gov<sub>r</sub> ernments, the findings of the Study Group were brought to the notice of the State Government/Chief Engineers for their guidance. It is
