[[THE DEPUTY MINISTER OF SCIENTIFIC RESEARCH AND CULTURAL AFFAIRS (DR. MONO MOHAN DAS) : The Population Map of the main Edition of the National Atlas will be in 16 plates, of which two are under print and two more are being drawn. These 4 plates are expected to be printed by September, 1959.

Of the remaining 12 plates, 4 are expected to be completed by the end of 1959, and 8 plates by the end of 1960.]

DR. MONO MOHAN DAS: The Hindi edition of our National Atlas has already been published. Now the main Atlas, which will be in English, is under preparation.

SHRI FARIDUL HAQ ANSARI: May I know, Sir, whether this Atlas will be published in all the regional languages?

DR. MONO MOHAN DAS: There is no such proposal before the Government at present.

SHRI V. K. DHAGE: Why not?

DR. A. N. BOSE: In any other national language?

DR. MONO MOHAN DAS: The first atlas of the Atlas Organisation has been published in Hindi. At present the edition in English is under preparation. After this work is completed, perhaps we may consider whether we will publish it in any other language.
